



Malcolm Roger Courts

January 2, 1936 - August 23, 2017

Malcolm “Roger” Courts was born on January 2, 1936, in Harttown, Mississippi. He was the youngest of five children born to Ernestine “Tina” Dorothy Hart Courts and Willie Gordon Courts. Roger’s parents, four siblings, and his beloved daughter, Amanda Leigh “Mandy” Courts preceded him in death.

Roger passed into the eternal, loving embrace of God on August 23, 2017, surrounded by his family. Until early this year, he was a vivacious and active 81 year old, who succumbed to a brief rapid-onset case of acute interstitial lung disease.

His proudest accomplishment and legacy is his seven children and thirteen grandchildren, all of whom honor him with their devotion and deep respect and love.

After growing up on the family farm in Pickens, Mississippi, Roger attended Holmes Junior College and Memphis State (University of Memphis), where he earned degrees in English and Psychology. For three years, Roger served in the U.S. Army Signal Corp as a photographer. He was stationed at Fort Richie, Maryland; Fort Churchill, Canada; and White Sands Proving Ground, New Mexico.

Following service, Roger was employed by Sacred Heart League & Southern Missions in Walls, Mississippi, where he devoted 42 years of professional service as its director and CEO. Among his numerous accomplishments as a servant leader, Roger was instrumental in distributing millions of copies of the Bible and the New Testament through the American Bible Society. For his efforts, Roger was made an Honorary Lifetime Member of ABS.

Roger also pioneered fundraising for the League’s ministries, becoming a nationally renowned nonprofit leader. In the late 1980s, Roger conceived the idea to produce a feature film, which conveyed Judeo-Christian values through its distribution around the world. “The Spitfire Grill,” won the 1996 Audience Award at the Sundance Film Festival, and profits from the sale of the film funded the construction of Sacred Heart School (K – 8), in Southaven, Mississippi.

In 1987, with the desire to promote pilgrimage tours to the Holy Land, Roger co-founded Travel 'N' Tours, Inc., the first travel and tour company in northwest Mississippi. Throughout 30 years, Roger facilitated tours for thousands of pilgrims to the land where Jesus walked, and to the holy sites and shrines of western Europe.

Roger was an avid photographer, videographer, scholar, writer, world traveler, and ballroom dancer (Arthur Murray School of Dance silver medalist).

Those whom Roger leaves behind to cherish his memory include his children and grandchildren: Christopher Courts (wife, Kim; children Matthew, Christian, Will); Mary Courts McCammon (husband, David; children Lauren Boone, Zachary

Boone, Cody, Kyle); Gregory Courts (wife, Lisa); Timothy Courts (children Mandy and Hannah); Sean Courts (wife, Betzabeth; children Autumn, Isabella, Nicholas); Kimberly Courts Clayton (daughter Olivia). Additionally, Roger's memory will be cherished by: his former wife, Jana Link Courts; his best friend and business partner of 35 years, Mark Ratay; his granddaughter in-law, Ashley Courts; and his former daughters in-law and sons in-law: Stacy Allison Litwa, Tracy Scott Courts; Ronnie Boone; and James Clayton. Roger also leaves behind numerous beloved nieces and nephews, and devoted friends both locally and around the world.

Visitation with the family will be on Saturday, August 26, beginning at 2:00 p.m. followed by a celebration of life memorial service at 4:00 p.m., Pastor Cheryl K. Cornish officiating. The visitation and service will take place at First Congregational United Church of Christ, 1000 South Cooper Street, Memphis, Tennessee 38104. Burial will be at the Courts family cemetery in Pickens, Mississippi.
