U.S. Naval Chief Petty Officer Ret. Warren Vincent "Andy" Anderson, 84, of Millington, TN passed away on Wednesday afternoon October 7, 2020 after a welllived life. A tech and gadget guru with a gruff exterior, he was ultimately a teddy bear who loved his pretzel sticks, Maryland Crab Cakes, and a squirt of ketchup on his spaghetti. A family hero who lived with six women in a one-bathroom house, Andy was preceded in death by the love of his life, his beautiful wife of 62 years, Virginia, and siblings Helen, Jim, Harrison, Pauline, and Evelyn. He is survived by his brother Charles, and five distinctive daughters Juliana Biggers (J.O.), Kelline Dent (Ted), Christine Yates (Steve), Mary Beth "Murph" Carver (Bobby), and Caroline Anderson.
