May 31, 1952 - May 8, 2025

With deep sadness, the family of Cassandra Lee Branch Stewart announces her falling asleep in death on Thursday, May 8, 2025, at Baptist East Memorial Hospital in Memphis, Tennessee, after an extended illness.

Cassandra was born on May 31, 1952, in Ft. Campbell, Kentucky, to William Edward Branch Sr. and Sara Lee Allen Branch. She attended Clarksville High School in Clarksville, Tennessee, where she majored in Music. There, she sang in the chorus and participated in many musical productions. After graduating in 1970, Cassandra continued her education at Austin Peay State University, earning a Bachelor of Science in 1977. She was a member of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority and continued nurturing her love for music by playing the piano, marching in the band, and singing in the university chorus.

Throughout her career, Cassandra worked in several management roles and later retired from the State of Tennessee Department of Labor in Memphis.

Cassandra found joy in laughter and loved games. She enjoyed watching the Memphis Grizzlies and playing on her computer. She liked electronic gadgets and delighted in coordinating pocketbooks with her shoes and outfits.

After an in-depth study of the Bible, Cassandra dedicated her life to Jehovah God and was baptized as one of Jehovah's Witness on July 4, 2009, in

Atlanta, Georgia. She found joy in sharing Bible truths with others and spent many hours writing letters encouraging people to study God's word. One of her favorite scriptures to share was Matthew 6:9-10, helping others understand the promises of Jehovah God's Kingdom as expressed in the Lord's Prayer.

In 2023, she attended Pioneer School for those in the full-time ministry, which she cherished deeply. She loved listening to and singing all of the original songs, especially Please Be Convinced, and was thrilled to contribute by helping with making costumes for a live Bible drama presented at a Regional Convention--an experience she held close to her heart. She just wanted to help and be an active participant in Jehovah's organization.

Cassandra will be dearly missed by all who knew and loved her. She is survived by her devoted nephew Don Dukes, Jr. and his wife Anna, who lovingly cared for her during the time she resided with them in Memphis, her brother William "Pete" Branch Jr. of Adelphi, Maryland, her sisters and brothers-in-law Cynthia White and her husband Angelo of Lawrenceville, Georgia, and Gerri Hammonds and her husband Michael of Decatur, Tennessee.
