Kirsten's obituary

Kirsten Morlock, 56, passed into eternity on November 29, 2021 in Memphis TN. She was born in Sioux City, Iowa on August 17, 1965 to Muriel (Smith) and Alan J. Stone. She was an only child. After graduating from Aurora West High School, Aurora IL in 1983, she graduated from Millikin University, Decatur IL, 1987 with a major in Biology and minor in Business. She was a member of the Alpha Chi Omega Sorority. Later she graduated with her MBA from Aurora University in Aurora IL, 1992. In 1990, she married Walter Morlock and two daughters, Callista and Payton, were born to this union. They later divorced.

Kirsten had a very successful career in environmental health, employed in Lake County, IL, Orange County, CA and Los Angeles CA. When moving to Arizona, Kirsten created her company Morlock Environmental which was a consulting and testing company for businesses which had water, food and soil concerns. She maintained the national and state certifications in her profession. In addition, she discovered another extremely compelling endeavor which was substituting in the public schools of Mesa, Gilbert and Chandler AZ. She took sub positions, short and long term, primarily in biology classes. Taking courses to achieve state certification, she was hoping to be able to take a full-time position in science. Her experiences in the classroom

were very satisfying for her and she received much encouragement to continue.
