sisters Priscilla B. Butler, of Tiptonville, TN and Sally L. Baker of Memphis, and her most loved

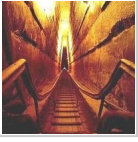
grandson, William Long of Nashville, TN. She also is survived by 5 cousins, 1 niece and two
