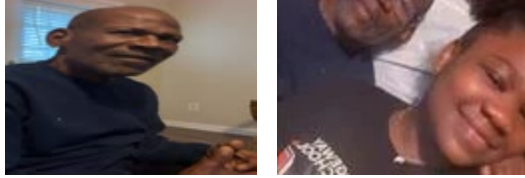
Mark Anthony Smith will be remembered for his joy, his humor, his love of family, and the way he made people feel simply by being himself. Though he may no longer walk beside us,

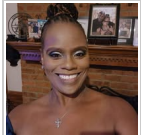

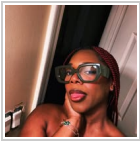

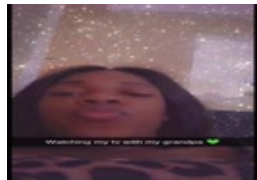
