Memphis, TN—Nathan Hill, 58, died January 20, 2023 in Memphis, Tenn. He was born October 11, 1964, in Chelsea, Vermont

After college, Nathan was the director of a nonprofit organization called Cooperative Computer Ministries that was supported by the Memphis Leadership Foundation. He repaired old, donated computers, and gave them to underprivileged children and many non-profits. When he arrived in Memphis, Tennessee in 1988, he joined Epworth United Methodist Church.

He had a heart for ministry to the elderly to those shut out of society.

He is survived by two sisters, Penny Gardner, and Kathy Savedra Davis; nieces, a nephew, and a cousin. A memorial service was held in Vermont on March 6, 2023. He is survived in Memphis by many friends, roommates, spiritual companions, and pastors who sponsored the work Nathan did with Cooperative Computer Ministries.
