Robert "Bob" Francis Wallace, 80, peacefully passed away on March 11th, 2023, at Germantown Methodist Hospital. Bob was born in Memphis, TN, on September 25th, 1942. He graduated from Catholic High School and earned his bachelor's degree at Memphis State University. Bob spent most of his career at RJ Reynolds Tobacco Company, retiring after 25 years.
